Our mission with young men and women continues to bear fruits in the different countries where we serve. We would like to report that, our evangelizing efforts in the world are changing lives. The peripheries of the cities where our parishes are located, the villages in rural areas, have been the fertile grounds for planting the seed of faith in the life of many young people in Africa, Central and South America. In the different environments of our missions we have managed to bring love, understanding, attention, joy, enthusiasm, hope, acceptance, faith and harmony in the present life of youth.

We have over 6,000 youth in our program called Exodos Juveniles (Youth movement) in Guatemala, Venezuela, Ecuador, Panama, Belize, Honduras and Kenya. The goal is to strengthen their Catholic faith so that they can then continue to work in their local parishes spreading the Good news. Some participants in the youth program will discern a vocation to the priesthood and begin their formation at the Fraternity's seminary in Guatemala City.

In the Vicariate of Iquitos in Peru, Fraternity priests help young boys in their discernment to their vocation. Some have become altar servants, others following the priest and deacons in their pastoral work looking for guidance.
