## Our seminarians—65 strong! The Fraternity's Future!

It's our joy to report that amidst the difficulties of the pandemic, our seminarians have embraced their vocation with increasing dedication and generosity.

This year has been unique with the requirement of social distancing and various safety protocols as the pandemic while easing remains a part of Guatemalan life. Our 65 seminarians continue to live the fraternal life and share as brothers in Christ.

In many ways this process has been an adventure for our seminarians as they have adjusted their way of learning by embracing online learning and instruction as well as using virtual methods to continue motivating youth in the many parishes served by the Fraternity in Guatemala.

Weekend pastoral activities are mandatory for all of our seminarians. This outreach nurtures and motivates the vocation of each seminarian and provides a level of support to Fraternity priests who serve as pastors in these parishes. Each year seminarians are assigned to a parish in Guatemala, Belize and Honduras where they organize different activities with youth, help

with catechesis in preparation for the reception of the Eucharist as well as Confirmation. In a very biblical sense our seminarians are required to go out in pairs (two by two) to different parishes to gain experience in evangelization. In this environment they grow in their missionary spirit and become more involved in the mission of the Catholic Church.

Workshops, retreats, and talks about vocational discernment are given to those who may be interested in enrolling at the the seminary in Guatemala City.



We utilize the different talents of our seminarians to motivate potential candidates for the priesthood by presenting the unique spirituality of the Fraternity.

Most of our candiates come from the parishes where the Fraternity priests serve. For those who have received God's call, they begin their discernment at the parish level and from there, are invited to participate in retreats and workshops, three times per year. After a period of evaluation these candidates are then welcomed to join the Fraternity as new seminarians.



As some of the restrictions of the pandemic continue to hamper our methods of formation and one on one contact, the use of digital platforms has been a blessing providing for continuous outreach to potential seminarians.





Going forward we look to continued use of virtual meetings as we return to person to person contact.

In June of 2022 we held a series of retreats for those interested in discerning a vocation to the priesthood. We are pleased to announce that 9 young men attended while expressing a strong desire to become missionary priests. Our prayers are that many more may make the same decision by the end of this year.

We sincerely hope that you have enjoyed this brief update on the status of our formation programs at the seminary in Guatemala. Please pray for vocations. In addition to your financial support we need your continued prayerful support. It seems so easy to say this but we want to assure you that this is not just a hollow request. There is power in prayer—it is what allows many of our priests working in difficult environments to continue following The Way and spreading the gospel message of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.
