New mission sites for the Fraternity



We are glad to report that this year we have been blessed with new mission areas to serve. Shown in the picture above, Fr. Marco Antonio Lorenzo (red chasuble) and Fr. Miguel Gonzalez (red stole) celebrate a welcoming mass with Bishop Jesus Aleman Chavez at Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Morris, Cuauhtemoc-Madera Diocese in Chihuahua, Mexico. Both priests previously served in Guatemala for several years prior. With missionary zeal they have embraced this new mission, our first in Mexico. The Diocese of Cuauhtemoc-Madera covers over 23,000 square miles which is served by 29 parishes. The Fraternity's new mission is at Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, in Moris, Chihuahua, with a Catholic population in excess of 5300.

Although the Catholic faith still has strong presence in Mexico there are many rural areas that are not well served. It is in just such remote an area as this where the Fraternity's willingness to serve allows the Missionary Fratenity of Mary to live out one of its charisms to go where needed to bring the sacraments and good news to the people.

A new mission in Peru

The Fraternity has a long presence in the Iquitos Apostolic Vicariate which is deep in the rainforests of Peru. Our new mission is now in the city of Lima at Santa Rosa de Callo Parish in the diocese of El Callao. Fr. Eder Escobar, our former General Superior openly welcomed a new assignment and has been appointed as the new Pastor. He will be assisted by Father Pedro Lima who previously ministered in Belice. It is a blessing to expand our presence in Peru and we look forward to serving in this new mission and supporting our brother priests currently in Peru. **Fr. Eder Escot**

The Fraternity through this parish wants to focus on these people, giving them hope and encouragement while instructing them in the power of prayer and belief in Jesus Christ. Of course, our Blessed Mother is always right by his side as we do emphasize Marian spirituality.
