## The Alb, the First Liturgical Vestment for a Seminarian.

#### On January 15th 2025, the Newly initiated seminarians of the Encounter Stage—Aspirancy received their albs for the first time.

The **alb** is the first liturgical vestment that a candidate for the priesthood receives. This vestment symbolizes dedication to the priestly vocation. This act marks the beginning of their journey toward the priestly ordination they will one day receive.

This white vestment signifies the self-denial and chastity that is befitting a priest. In this initial stage of their formation, our seminari-



ans begin to shape their priestly life with this vestment. In the Fraternity, the "Encounter Stage - Aspirancy" takes place at the San Bartholomew Apostol formation house (located in San Lucas Sacatepéquez) and is part of the entire process of the Paul VI Major Seminary of the Missionary Fraternity of Mary. The blessing of Albas took place during the celebration of the Eucharist, presided by Fr. Oswaldo Pérez, Prefect of Formation, and concelebrated by several priests of the Fraternity. The participation of some of our seminarians' parents was also very significant.

#### The Greenhouse Project at the Seminary

One of the four dimensions of formation for the future missionary priest in the Fraternity is the Human-Fraternal Dimension.

This dimension, which aims to develop the human quality of the missionary, does not overlook any aspect of human sensitivity, such as the love of work in the simple things of life, such as cultivating the land and enjoying its fruits. The Fraternity's missionaries in the U.S. held their annual retreat for 2025.

From February 17 to 21, the Fraternity's missionaries working in the U.S. held their spiritual retreat at the Xaverian Missionaries' House in Milwaukee. It was led by diocesan priest José Gonzalez, who began his meditations with the motto: "With our eyes on Jesus." Fr. Gonzalez developed his reflections on the most critical moments of a priest's vocational and ministerial life and how these should always be the first love that drives the constant renewal with which one must live.
